1. About the department

The Department of Food Science, Nutrition and Technology (DFSNT) is one of the leading Departments in the Faculty of Agriculture, College of Agriculture and Veterinary Sciences (CAVS), University of Nairobi. The Department is located off Kapenguria Road, 15 Kms to the Northwest of the Nairobi Central Business District. DFSNT degree programmes have evolved from one to six; both in undergraduate and a certificate in Food Safety and Quality. The Department serves a wide range of students from Kenya and all over the world including countries such as: Nigeria, Malawi, Uganda, DRC, Somalia, Malawi, Cameroon, Ghana, Rwanda, Nigeria, Ethiopia, Sudan, South Sudan, Tanzania and Mozambique among others. This is attributed to the quality and competitiveness of the programmes offered, the highly trained and competent teaching staff as well as the modern and fully-functional equipment and facilities.

Numerous research activities are carried out by staff and students in the fields of food security, applied human nutrition, sports nutrition, new products development, value addition, quality management and processing. DFSNT research and development activities address both national and regional issues which lend themselves to key aspects of Kenya's vision 2030 and important aspects of the Big Four Agenda.

2.0 WORKSHOPS AND CONFERENCES

The staff and student of the department took part in a number of high profile and informative workshops and conferences. Each of these events provided good avenues for productive learning as well as dissemination of research and innovations from the Department.

2.1 AGRO 2019 Conference and Exhibition

The AGRO 2019 Conference and Exhibition was held as part of the annual University of Nairobi Research week that took place on 22-24th October 2019 at the College of Agriculture and Veterinary Sciences. The Department contributed more than 10 out of the 180 abstracts/oral presentations and exhibitions. Most of the presentations were made by graduate

students who are being mentored in their academic endeavours. The Department was also part of the exhibition team being led by the pilot plant and FRUVASE project team that displayed new and innovative products from guava and cowpeas leaves.

2.2 African Potato Association (APA) Conference





African Potato Association brings together experts and stakeholders in potato, sweet potato and related tubers research and innovation every two years. In 2019, the conference was held in Kigali, Rwanda and was attended by scientists from across the world. The conference included oral presentations, posters and field excursions. Interactive sessions and panel discussions were also held for the audience to get a clear outlook on emerging issues. The department was represent by Dr. George Abong who also made presentations on roots and tubers research conducted in collaboration with the department. At the end of the conference, APA held its assembly and elected leaders to stee r the association for the next two years prior to the next event to be held in Malawi.

2.3 Food Science and Technology Platform of Kenya (FoSTeP-K) Conference





FoSTeP-K is an association of experts in food science and technology, nutrition and related fields that brings together like minded individuals for purposes of networking, capacity building and exchange of knowledge and ideas. The organization held a conference in October 2019 that brought together scientist from Kenya, USA, Congo, Uganda, Malawi and Mozambique. The Department was represented in this conference by a number of staff and students who actively engaged in oral presentation, training and interactions.

2.5 FANUS Conference

The conference involved plenary presentations focused on the theme and other subthemes involving nutritional research nutritional policies development and implementation, economic and health implications of sustainable nutritional programmes and the malnutrition among other related themes

2.6 Codex CCAfrica



CODEX African region (CCAFRICA) held its 23rd meeting in Nairobi, Kenya. The meeting focused on food safety in the region and was attended by more than 30 member states with Kenya as the coordinator. Kenya chaired all the plenary meetings as a coordinator and steered the meeting to its conclusion with the able leadership of the Chair (Dr. Maritim from Directorate of Veterinary Services) assisted by Dr. George Abong from the Department of Food Science, nutrition and Technology. In the meeting, a number of standards from the region were discussed and moved to the next stages of development, while key side events such as antimicrobial resistance and chemical risk assessment using total diet study from West Africa. A draft implementation plan to support codex strategic plan for the next 4 years was also initiated.

2.7 Tropentag and FruVaSe workshop



The Fruits and Vegetables for all seasons which is funding PhD and Msc students in the department held its annual meeting at the University of Goettingen, Germany. The department was represented by the Chairman, Dr. Abong who is also the project s coordinator and Mr. Joshua Ombaka, a PhD student under the project. Joshua also made a poster presentation at the Tropentag conference, which is held annually across Europe

2.8 Codex Committee Workshop



The National Codex Technical Committee convened at Panorama hotel, Naivasha from 15th-20th September with the objective of reviewing Draft Guidelines for supporting the development of harmonized food laws for Africa region. Committee members were drawn from the following institutions: Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS), University of Nairobi (DFSNT), Department of Veterinary Services (DVS), Fisheries Service, Kenya Plant Health Inspectorate Services, Kenya Industrial Research & Development Institute, Agriculture and Food Authority (HCD), State Department for Trade, Government Chemist, National Public Health Laboratory and Nestle Kenya limited.

2.9 Scaling readiness training workshop

Dr. Abong was among the participants who attended a training workshop on scaling readiness-a concept whereby research activities that have gone through proof of concept can be scaled up to a achieve impact in the larger community. The training was held at Jakaranda Hotel in Nairobi Kenya on 3-5 April 2019.

2.10 One Health Masterclass - Summer School of the One Health Regional Network for the Horn of Africa

The HORN One Health Masterclass was an intensive, residential training course for early career researchers based in the Horn of Africa (Kenya, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Somalia and Somaliland). The masterclass was focused upon improving One Health research capacity of both individuals and institutes, through a mixture of taught sessions, practical exercises and training of "One Health champions .

The HORN project summer school was held at the Mpala Research Conservancy, in a semi-arid ecosystem in central Kenya. It was chosen to represent the semi-arid environments that exist widely across the Horn of Africa. The Summer School took place between 11-15th March 2019. Being at Mpala, the focus was on "in the field or real-world data collection, analysis and processing. Access to a laboratory for specialist skills was however limited. The Summer School was located at Mpala s Ewaso Nyiro River Camp and the Mpala Research Centre



Dr Jeff Wamiti and several postgraduate students from the Department participated in this masterclass that was focussed on One Health topics. The masterclass provided in-depth learning opportunities to increase knowledge in quantitative skills in epidemiology, social science approaches, laboratory skills and techniques, and transferable research skills.

3. Renovation and repairs in the Department
